

“4+1” composed in 1994, is constructed with the notes G#, A#, B, C(4)+C#(1) the prevailing expression here is mechanical, motor-like and violent. For example, towards the end of the piece, there is an attempt to portray a broken waltz machine. The added note C#, is used mainly to soften the metallic world and to provide a point rest within it.

The work was first Performed and recorded CD in 1995, by the Israeli Pianist Ora Rotem-Nelken.
