SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

1.1 Racing will be governed by:

The rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024 (RRS). Changes to rules are described in the relevant sailing instruction.

1.2 In the event of a conflict between the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions then the Sailing Instructions shall take precedence. This changes RRS 63.7.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on St Mawes Sailing Club's website.

3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Written changes to these Sailing Instructions will be posted not later than 2000hrs on the day before the change comes into effect.

4. SIGNALS

4.1 VHF Channel 69 will be used for communications with competitors. If this proves to be impractical, an alternative radio channel will be announced to competitors on Channel 69 before the Warning Signal.

5. SCHEDULE OF CLASSES AND START TIMES

5.1 The schedule of classes is as follows:

* Note. If there are less than 3 Sunbeams they will race in the Handicap Yachts class

6. THE COURSES AND MARKS

There are no pre-set courses – the VHF announcement will include the marks to be rounded (see Annex A), the side on which they are to be left, and the order in which they are to be rounded.

7. LOCAL VARIATIONS AND OBSTRUCTIONS

7.1 Moving exclusion zones around commercial shipping are designated as obstructions.

7.2 Commercial and naval shipping: Areas around commercial and naval vessels under way and constricted in their ability to manoeuvre are designated as moving exclusion zones. Such exclusion zones extend to 100m on all sides of the vessel and around tugs, pilot/harbour authority boats and official boats escorting the vessel. A boat shall not enter the exclusion zone, and, if becalmed, shall use any method of propulsion to move out of the way. This shall only be sufficient to move out of the exclusion zone by the safest possible route and shall not offer the boat significant advantage in the race.

- 7.3 Exclusion zones extend 25m around a dive vessel displaying code flag A, an inflatable orange buoy marking a diver just under the surface, and a diver on the surface. A boat shall not enter the 25m zone.
- 7.4 Any boat that fails to comply with these Local Variations and Obstructions may be disqualified by the Race Officer without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1.
- 7.5 If any leg of the course requires boats to pass St Mawes cardinal mark (Lugo), it must be passed on its safe navigational side.

8. THE STARTING AND FINISHING LINE

- 8.1 The starting and finishing line is an imaginary line between the mast of the committee boat displaying an orange flag and a yellow pillar buoy. Boats will start in a roughly south-westerly direction. Boats may be required to cross the line during the course of the race. Boats will finish by crossing the line from the last mark (this may be in a roughly south-westerly direction, or in a roughly north-easterly direction).
- 8.2 It is intended that the committee boat will be anchored just south or southeast of the moorings off Tavern Beach.
- 8.3 The St Mawes One Design Class Association agrees that for the purposes of the definition of "Start" and "Finish" and rules 21.1, 29.1, 30 and 44.2 of the RRS (but not any other rules) the term "hull" includes a boat's bowsprit in its normal position.

9. THE START

- 9.1 Warning Signals will be made 10 minutes before each class start, followed by a Preparatory Signals at 5 minutes before each class start. This changes RRS 26.

10. SHORTEN COURSE

- 10.1 The course may be shortened in one of two ways:
- 10.2 In accordance with RRS 32.2 (a) – at a rounding mark between the mark and a RIB displaying Flag S
- 10.3 If the committee boat displays Flag S and makes two sound signals, when boats sail through the start/finish line at the end of a round.

11. TIME LIMITS

- 11.2 The time limit will 120 minutes for the first boat in each class to finish. If one boat in a class finishes within the time limit, then the time limit for that class will be extended to 30 minutes after the finish time of the first boat, or the original time limit, whichever is the later. Boats which finish outside the time limit will be scored DNF. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.

12. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 12.1 Procedure. Protest forms are available from St Mawes Sailing Club's office and protests or requests for redress should be lodged there within one hour after the time of the last boat's finish.
- 12.2 Notification of Parties. Protest notices will be posted within 30 minutes of the protest time limit to inform competitors where and when there is a hearing in which they are parties to a hearing or named as a witness. No further notification of parties will be made.

13. SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 13.1 RRS 40 (Use of Y Flag) will not apply. It is the skipper's responsibility to ensure that their boat carries sufficient life jackets for all its crew. It is the skipper's responsibility to ensure that all persons on board wear lifejackets when appropriate.
- 13.2 RETIREMENTS Any boat that retires should make every effort to notify the committee boat or a safety boat.

14. PRIZEGIVING

- 14.1. A prizegiving will take place in the Clubhouse as soon as practicable after completion of the race.

Speed Limit Buoys

In the entrance to St Mawes Bay there are four speed limit buoys, each of which is marked 8 KNOTS. For the purposes of racing at StMSC they will be designated as follows (from the most north-western to the most south-eastern): SB1, SB2, SB3 and SB4 (although they are not marked as such).
