Telegram which was intercepted by the British Force at Meshed despatched from Moscow and addressed to Tashkent.

"Jumbo M.T. 27 NO.766. To Mustafa Suphi from Sayid Galiev (Sultan Mir Sayid Galiev Z.T.) President of the East Committee.

Three comrades have arrived here from Constantinople named Hüseyin Sayid, Baha Ali and Patfi (? Z.T.) It is desirable that you should come here."

On 13 February 1920 it was decided at a meeting at Constantinople of Turkish Communists, to send Hüseyin Sayid with a report for Mustafa Suphi to Moscow. Mustafa Suphi is a Turk and is assistant to Stalin in Eastern Section Moscow Propoganda Bureau.

Intercepted telegrams by the British Force

December 2 nd, 1920, Lenin (Moskow) to Erivan.

"We ought not to quarrel with the Kemalists but on the other hand it is almost impossible for them to have their own way entirely."

December 14 th, 1920, Lenin to Erivan.

"You must insist to the utmost on a Soviet propoganda in Turkey, especially in Mustafa Kemal's Army and expose the double faced officers of the Kemalists. Let the Turkish Communists open a campaign on a large scale in favour of Russo-Turk alliance against the Entente."
