"I then received instructions from Lord Curzon  
that I should, if possible, see Mustapha Kemal  
again and endeavour to ascertain as definitely as  
might be possible from him what Peace terms his  
party were expecting to obtain, and what conditions  
(short of the terms of their "Pact" which was  
looked upon as impossible) they would be pre-  
pared to accept. At the same time it was to  
be officially understood that I was returning to  
Anatolia on purely military duty, for the purpose  
of reporting as to the fulfilment by the Turks  
of the military conditions of the Armistice..."
