Dear Professor Tuncay,

thank you for your letter dated 16th June, 1983 and for sending us additional documents for your application.

We also have, in the meantime, received the recommendation letter of Professor Mümtaz Soysal. Your documents are, however, still not fully complete.

In our letter dated 12th April, 1983 we requested on page 2 that - amongst other missing documents - reprints of two to three of your most recent and most important scientific publications (or very detailed abstracted versions in English language if these publications are written in Turkish language) should be sent to us. So far we have not received any reprints or detailed resumées - with the exception of two Turkish books that Mr. Blaschke sent us and that we returned to him after copying the bibliography as our Selection Committee only accepts publications or resumées in English, French or German language.

I may again ask you to formulate resumées of two to three publications of your own choice which you consider as your most important ones and which should be written at a more recent date. These resumées should summarize in a very comprehensive form research problem, methodical aspects and results obtained of the respective publications. I would urgently recommend that these resumées should have a length of at least ten pages rather than five to six pages as it is very important that our Selection Committee gains a very well documented impression of your present scientific work.

It would not be possible to take a decision without these texts as this decision is based on a merely scientific evaluation of the applications. In addition your case is a special one due to having exceeded the age-limit. Our Selection Committee will have to decide whether an exception can be made. For these reasons we require a well documented application especially concerning the scientific aspects.

I would also appreciate if you could inform us on the name and address of the scientist with whom you have closely worked together during your stay at Stanford University in 1979/1980.

I hope that you will be able to send us the abstracted versions of your publications as soon as possible (hopefully by the beginning of August at the very latest) so that a decision on your application will be possible in November, 1983 as it was planned.
