2. Location: Unesco Regional Office for Education in Asia.

3. Background and Functions:

Unesco, as the technical agency for education, advises UNICEF in regard to its aid programmes for education in Asia, particularly the identification, preparation and evaluation of projects and the technical side of project implementation. UNICEF is assisting a number of educational projects in the various countries of the Asian region. At the request of Member States, new programmes of assistance are developed, guided by the policies adopted by the Executive Boards of Unesco and UNICEF (Ref: Joint Recommendations of the Director-General of Unesco and the Executive Director of UNICEF on UNICEF Assistance to Education).

In order to strengthen further the technical cooperation between Unesco and UNICEF in assisting the Member States in developing and implementing programmes designed to meet the educational needs of children in school and out-of-school, the post of Educational Adviser has been created in the Unesco Regional Office for Education in Asia, Bangkok, Thailand.

Under the supervision and control of the Director of the Unesco Regional Office for Education in Asia, the incumbent will perform the following functions:

- a) working in close cooperation and consultation with the UNICEF Regional Offices and UNICEF Area Offices in the countries of the Asian region, advise them on the identification, selection, and evaluation of educational projects assisted by UNICEF and also advise on the technical side of project implementation;
 - b) in consultation and cooperation with UNICEF, advise and assist Member States, at their request, in the diagnosis of the educational needs of children and the formulation of appropriate development programmes related to meeting the basic learning needs of children, including notably preschool age groups, in the light of the Joint Recommendations of the Director-General of Unesco and the Executive Director of UNICEF on assistance to education;
 - c) assist and work closely with Unesco experts in the country on projects which are assisted by UNICEF and Unesco;
 - d) iparticipate in meetings, conferences and training courses organised under UNESCO/UNICEF programmes;
 - e) undertake field missions, visit projects and assist the project personnel in the development of projects;

- f) assist in collecting and disseminating information and data on new approaches and techniques for meeting the educational needs of children, and in particular children in pre-school age groups and children in disadvantaged groups and areas;
- g) prepare periodical reviews and reports on the progress of assisted programmes;
- h) carry out such other duties as may be assigned from time to time by the Director of the Unesco Regional Office for Education in Asia.

4. Qualifications:

- a) high qualifications in education with sound understanding of the broad field of education;
- b) special knowledge of and experience in developmental education related to early cycles of education and including non-formal modes of education;
 - c) thorough familiarity with the problems of educational development and the learning needs of young children in the developing countries, notably in Asia;
 - d) experience in operational field work and capacity to undertake intensive touring duties;
- e) writing ability of a high order.
- 5. Language Qualifications: fluent command of English essential; good working knowledge of French an asset.
- 6. Duration of Appointment: one year with possibility of renewal, commencing as soon as possible after expiry of deadline for receipt of applications.
