STATEMENT OF THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE OF THE COMMUNIST PARTY OF TURKEY

The government has concluded an agreement with the heads of Türk-İş. Essentially, this compromise is the implementation of the demands of imperialist monopolies, the International Monetary Fund and the collaborating big bourgeoisie.

By means of this compromise, the domestic and foreign monopolies aim to freeze wages, directly increase exploitation, abrogate trade union rights and wipe out the economic and social gains of the working class. In this way they hope to further foist the burden of the crisis onto the backs of the working class and labouring masses.

This compromise seeks to prop up the yellow trade-unionist leadership of Türk-İş. This compromising agreement is aimed at bringing the trade union movement under the control of the bourgeoisie and, in particular, at preventing the organisation of class trade unions in the state sector. It limits the right of workers to choose their place of work freely, while legalising wholesale reprisals and mass sacking of workers. It deprives the demand for the right of referendum of its democratic essence.

The bourgeoisie is seeking to spread class-collaborationism within the labour movement via the yellow trade-unionists. It is thus striving to curb the struggle of the working class and "incorporate" the working class into capitalism. To this end, it is trying to create a labour-aristocracy and split the labour movement with deceptions of "profit-sharing", "partnership in the enterprise" and "participation in management". It is trying to mitigate the class struggle.

This compromise is a blow to the trade unions' independence from the bourgeoisie and bourgeois governments. The principle of the membership's right to express their views and decide matters of wages and trade union demands, trade union democracy, is trampled underfoot.

By this compromising agreement, the heads of the government and Türk-İş are pitting the working class against the peasantry and other labouring masses. They hope to tear down the foundations of the solidarity between the working class and all labouring sections of the population, to impede unity of the forces fighting against imperialism and fascist escalation.

The signatories to this document frequently resort to demagoguery and phrase mongering in order to mask these truths. They link the cause of the crisis, the economic deadlock, to workers' wages. They claim that the cause of the political crisis, is the class struggle. In this way, they are defending the position of the monopoly bourgeoisie, concealing their aims behind a cloak of demagoguery. In doing so, they hope to hide the real reasons behind the crisis: dependence on imperialism, capitalist exploitation, the rule of the collaborating monopoly bourgeoisie and fascist escalation.

On the other hand, they insist that the working class should give up the struggle for its class interests in the state sector. In reality, these methods accelerate the process whereby the monopolies merge with the state.

Under what conditions was this compromise concluded? Imperialism and NATO's pressure on Turkey is increasing. The reactionary-fascist forces and the Maoists are stepping up their attacks. Efforts to draw the government to the right are intensifying. The monopoly bourgeoisie, the MESS bosses have engaged in a new assault on the working class, the Metal Workers' Union (Maden-İş), in particular. The reactionary-fascist forces, the collaborators of imperialism, are taking advantage of the vacillation of the government and this new assault on the workers' movement and stepping up their demagogy.

By bowing to the pressures of the imperialist monopolies and the reactionary-fascist forces, by giving concessions to them, the government is forfeiting the support of the people. Opposition to this policy is building up within the Republican People's Party (RPP). Imperialism and the collaborating big bourgeoisie are endeavouring to have the RPP-dominated government carry out the plans they were unable to implement through the reactionary-fascist coalition. The overt, crude methods of repression and terror applied by the previous government are being replaced by more refined, covert methods.

This compromise, which foresees the freezing of wages and slashing of worker's rights, is another link in the chain which already comprises a taxation policy harmful to the working class and low income groups, and rising prices which are crippling our people. In conjunction with this, repression directed against progressive forces, democratic rights and freedoms is intensifying.

At the very inception of this government, the TKP issued a statement telling our people that, despite the promises it made to the people, the government could adopt such an attitude, explaining the class and political reasons behind this. The government's efforts to infect the working class with conciliation and pacifism, its intention to back yellow trade unionism and make this a base of support were emphasised at the Plenum of the Central Committee. Events are confirming our Party's view.

The TKP upholds trade union unity on the basis of the interests of the working class. It upholds the unity of DİSK, Türk-İş and independent unions in struggle against imperialism, the fascist menace and capitalist exploitation. This struggle is an inseparable link in our people's struggle for national independence and democracy. The TKP calls on all national, democratic forces to oppose together this assault on the working class.

The reactions building up in the working class and trade union movement against this compromise between a handful of yellow trade unionists and the government, show that the working class will not abandon its road of struggle. The fascist escalation, gaining strength from imperialism, this principal danger, cannot be fought successfully without uncompromisingly defending the rights and freedoms of the working class, without uncompromisingly defending class trade unionism.

INFORMATION – TURKEY AND HUMAN RIGHTS

In the period since the reactionary-fascist coalition government was replaced by the Republican People's Party (RPP)-dominated government, in the beginning of this year, imperialism and NATO have intensified their pressure on our country and people. Severe repression and attacks directed against communists and progressive and democratic forces, have continued under the government of Prime Minister Ecevit, a member of the socialist international. At a time when American imperialism and the NATO'ist forces have intensified their attack against the socialist countries, under the cover of "human rights", the most basic human rights and freedoms are being trod underfoot by the ruling circles in Turkey. Turkey is the only country in Europe where the Communist Party is banned.

In our country, security of human life has disappeared. In the big cities the people fear to go out after dark. Readers of democratic newspapers and publications are subjected to open attacks. There are definite districts which people who do not live there cannot enter freely. Since the establishment of this government, in the past seven months, more than 400 people have been killed by the bullets of fascist commandoes, the secret and uniformed police and Maoist provocateurs. Thousands more have been wounded. The targets of these attacks are the communists, progressive and democratic forces and the left-wing of the RPP. The aim of this mounting fascist terror is to draw the government further to the right, hinder its developing of relations with the socialist countries, to fan in our country as well the wind of cold war incited by imperialism, make this government do what the bourgeoisie couldn't accomplish using reactionary governments, and cow the progressive forces.

The Nationalist Action Party (NAP), the fascist party supported by imperialist circles and the collaborating big bourgeoisie, is using social demagogy in an effort to attract the masses, who have been intimidated. This party has occupied some important key positions in the state apparatus and in the army.

In such a situation, the government remains a spectator to the fascist danger. It is not dispersing the dens of aggression. It is turning its back on the promises it made to the people, maintaining a hesitant, wavering attitude.

Under the Ecevit government, investigations and repression of progressive forces and publications have intensified. Journals, such as "Ürün" and "Problems of Peace and Socialism", publications such as the "TKP Programme" and the "Documents of the TKP Conference" are being confiscated. Progressive publishers are being brought to court. 26 out of 47 issues of the "Ürün" journal have been confiscated. One progressive journalist-writer faces a possible sentence of 156 years in prison.

The trial of the "Ürün" publishers who published the "TKP Programme" is to be held in the İstanbul 5th Criminal Court. It will begin on the 17th of October. The prosecutor is demanding that the publishers be tried under article 141 of the Criminal Code. His tactic is thus to turn a charge concerning a publication into one concerning a secret organisation. The trial of "Temel" publishers for publishing the "Documents of the TKP Conference" is continuing in the Ankara First Criminal Court. The next hearing will be on the 27th of October. The prosecution is demanding that the publishers be tried under article 142 of the Criminal Code. Articles 141 and 142 were adopted from the Criminal Code of fascist Italy and then made even harsher. They ban the Communist Party of Turkey and the conducting of propaganda in the interests of the working class. Today the struggle for the repeal of these articles, articles which are directed not only against communists but against all progressive forces, has embraced wide masses in Turkey.

Investigations have been launched into 54 democratic organisations in connection with the shouting of slogans and carrying of placards demanding "Freedom to the TKP!" by the tens of thousands on May Day in May Day (Taksim) Square in İstanbul. Interrogation of the leaders of these organisations began on 16th of June. All these trials and investigations are essentially contrary to the Helsinki Final Document and basic human rights.

The ruling circles are also resorting to new provocations with the establishment of fake communist parties. Making use of TKP-ML, other counter-feiters hiding behind socialist masks using the names TKP (R), TKP (B), are involved in these attempts.

In recent days, those who are closely tied to reactionary bourgeois circles, agents of the National Intelligence Agency (MİT), and the CIA, came forward with an attempt to establish a fake "Communist Party of Turkey". This provocation, which is centred around the "Katkı" journal, has no relations, whatsoever with the working class movement or with the communist movement. The aim of the collaborating big bourgeoisie is to undermine the rapidly growing authority which the Communist Party of Turkey has among the working class, to confuse the masses and blunt the working class struggle. These efforts are in harmony with the RPP-dominated government's measures

directed at rolling back class trade unionism, curbing the working class movement and supporting class collaboration.

All these attacks and provocations have intensified in the days since the TKP issued its call to all anti-imperialist, anti-fascist parties, organisations and forces to establish a national democratic front – for national independence, peace, security, disarmament, democratic rights and freedoms.

The Central Committee of the TKP has given to fraternal parties information about all these developments.
